Speakers:

- Faye Blake – Executive Director for Pathways to Success
Started in 2016 by Ms. Faye Blake, she decided to follow her passion and she really wanted to provide services for youth.
- There are 24 pockets of poverty throughout Sussex County.
- They work with where the most help is needed with youth.
- Who they connect with are children who have low grades, behavior programs, poverty etc.?
- Notified when a child that is part of Pathways they will sit with the child in class and make sure things are ok. They are trying to help the children to understand that they are valued and valuable.
- Pathways is in 4 school, Milford, Cape, Seaford, Sussex Tech
- 300 kids
- Pathway is an advocate for the Parents and the Child to make sure they are receiving support.

- Math and English enrichment in 9th grade for the afterschool program. They get life skills, resume writing, etc.
- They help children with job places
- They work with the youth in 9th grade for 5 years. They continue with youth the first year after high school to help the transition.
- 98 percent on time graduation rate.
- They prep with SAT
- They work with the Parents
- They provide support services and started with food insecurity in 3 of the schools they are in.
- 96 percent of the kids go into colleges, military, or a full-time work force.
- 6 pm on May 24th the cord ceremony
- 120 kids that will be graduating
- Two Summits a year. November is the Girls Summit and the Boys is in May. 2018 & 2019 was over 300 young ladies & 350 young men attend.
- Lunch & Learns are provided for these youth. They are looking to gear up more mental health speakers around teen dating violence.
